


Week 2 Quilting Diagrams & Tip Sheet







In this week's challenge, we are taking the same pointed arc shape we learned last week and learning several different ways to use it. From an allover meander to a thread painted design, I think you will find at least one of these designs to use on your quilt.

These are just a few of the ways you can use the leaf shape to add detail to your quilts.

An Allover Meander

The trick to successfully quilting a meandering design all over your quilt, is to try to quilt the leaves in all different directions. When there isn't a noticable pattern, our eyes will only see a beautiful allover texture.

As a Fern

Lining up the leaves so that they extend from a side of the block is a great way to draw attention to an area of the quilt. I used it the leaf portion of my panel, but this also works in borders or with other quilting designs


• Thready Leaves

While it's not perfect for all quilts, you can really add a pop of texture to your quilts with this thready version of the leaf design. Traveling along the edge of the leaves will helps you get from one to the next.



Quilting Diagrams

If you are having trouble quilting the design, practing tracing along the lines until you feel comfortable with the path of the design, then try quilting it on your quilt sandwich.




Your Challenge:

You can either quilt each section with a different design, or group sections together and fill them with the same design. Try echoing larger shapes to make them more manageable.
