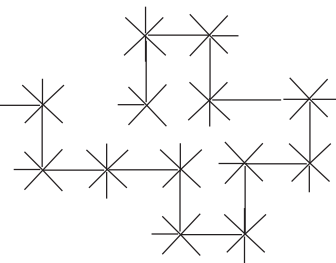


Easy Piano Key border designs without rotating the ruler.

A curvy side for an unexpected look!

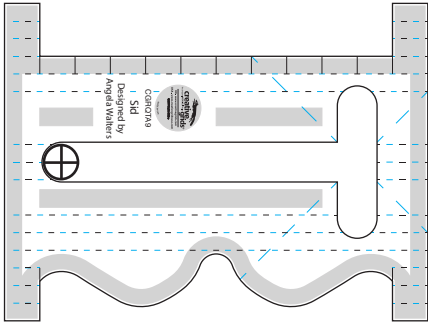

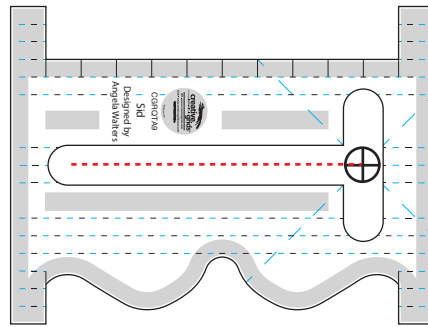

How to Quilt Starbursts

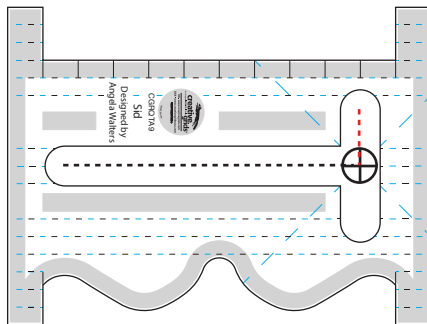

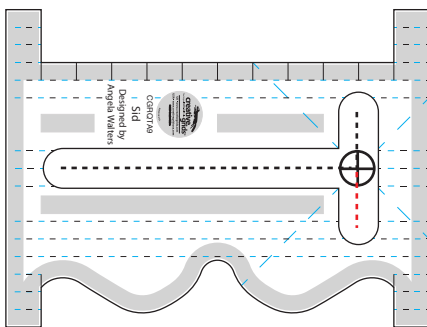
Place your quilting foot inside of the ruler so that it is all the way to one side.



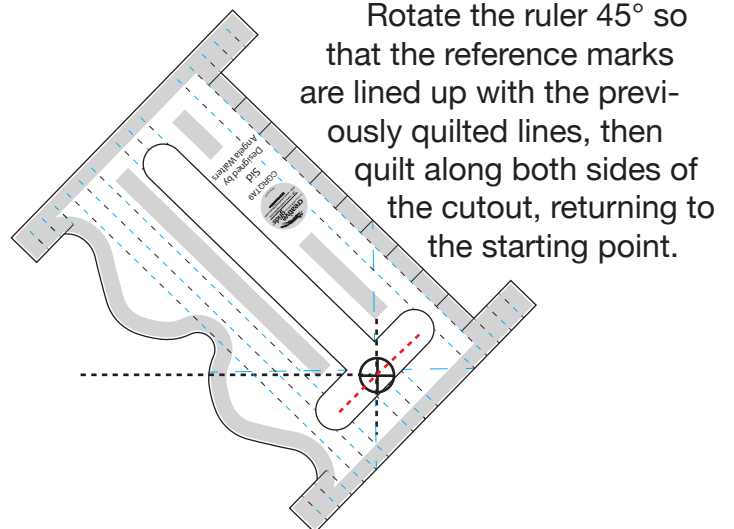
Quilt along the cutout until you reach the other end.



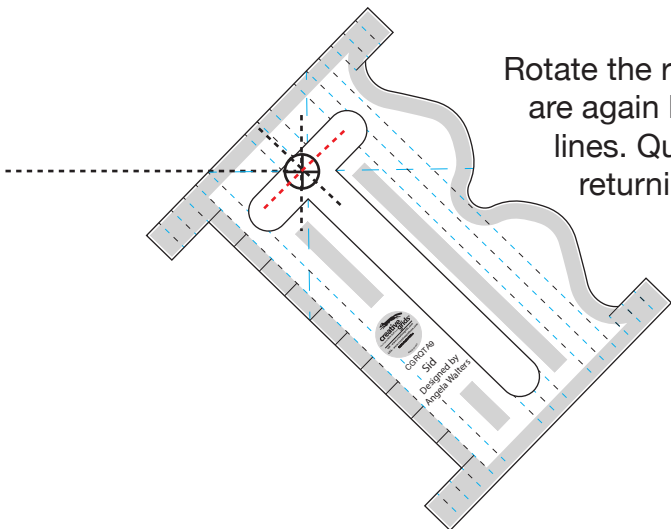
Quilt up along the vertical cutout to the end, then quilt back to the starting point.



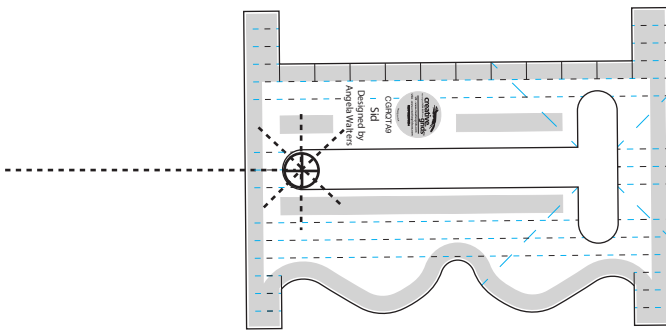
Quilt down, then back to the starting point.



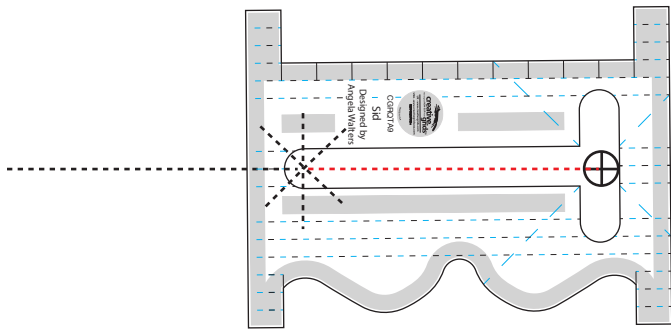
Rotate the ruler 45° so that the reference marks are lined up with the previously quilted lines, then quilt along both sides of the cutout, returning to the starting point.



Rotate the ruler 180° so that reference lines are again lined up with the previously quilted lines. Quilt along both sides of the cutout returning to the starting point.



Rotate the ruler so that it is horizontal and the foot of the machine is at the end of the cutout.



Repeat the steps above, quilting along the cutout and rotating the ruler to create the starburst shape.
