

Welcome to the second week of the Echoes & Curves Free-motion Challenge Quilting Along. In this week's challenge we are going to learn variations of the serpentine lines designs as well as how to turn the corners of borders with it.

### *Quilting Serpentine Line Variations*

Using one design in several different ways makes it more versatile and can also produce different effects on your quilt. In this video, I share a few of my favorite variations. However, these are just the beginning, you can do so much more with them. So have fun trying to come up with your own fun variations.

### *Turning the Corner*

The Serpentine lines design is perfect for thinner borders and sashings, but there will be times that you will need to turn the corner. It can be a little confusing at first, but just work through a couple turns and you will have it down pat! Remember to quilt to the inner corner, skip past the outer corner, then keep going until the outer edge is ahead of the inner edge.

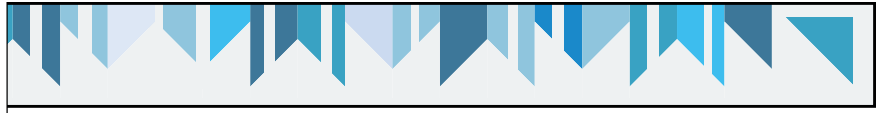
### *Your Challenge:*

If you're quilting along with me on the custom Echoes and Curves panel, quilt serpentine lines variations in areas highlighted. Try quilting them around the corners if you'd like!

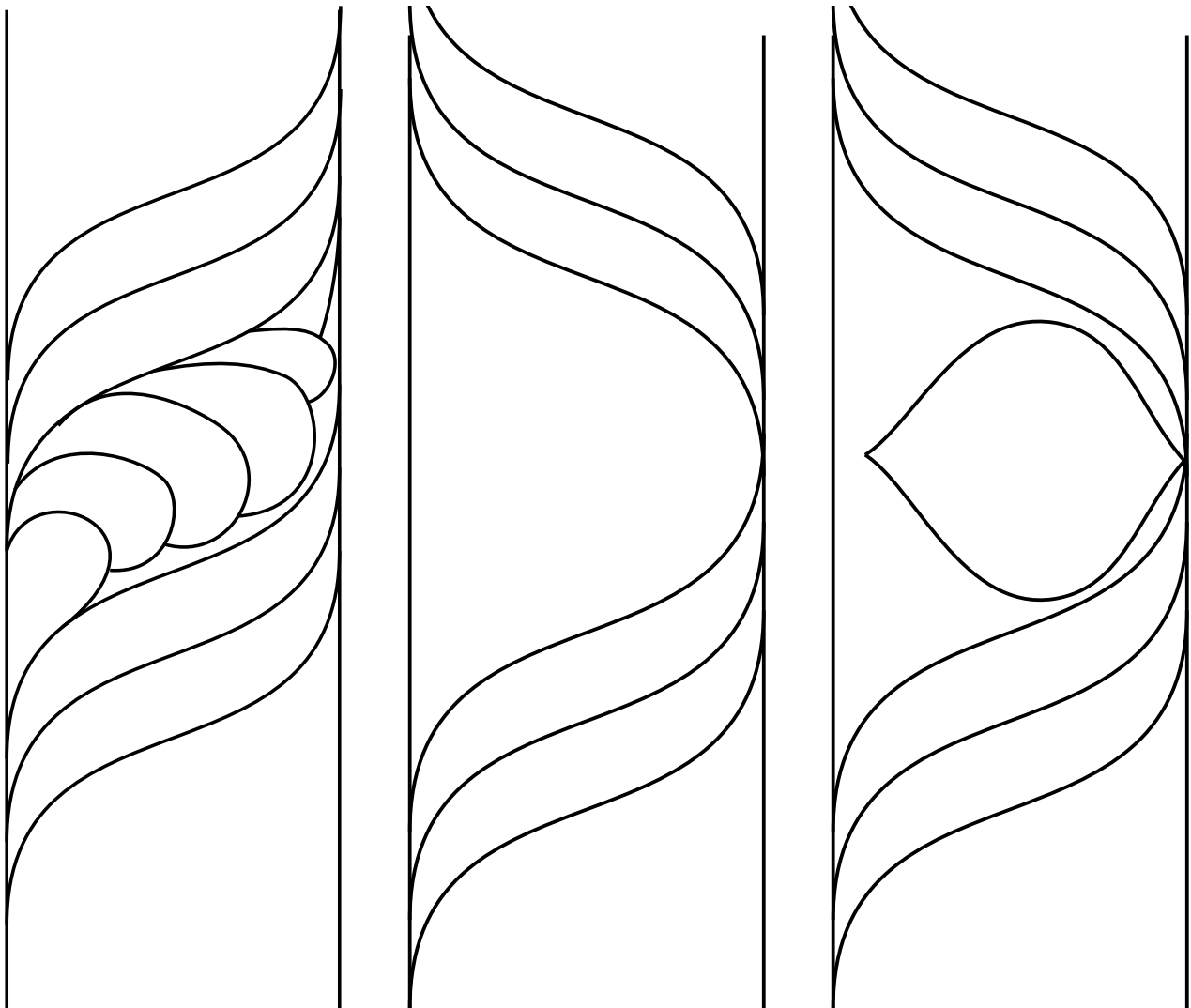
