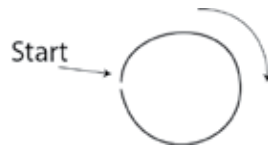
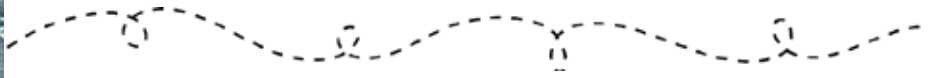
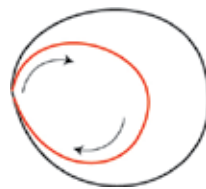


Echoed Pebbles

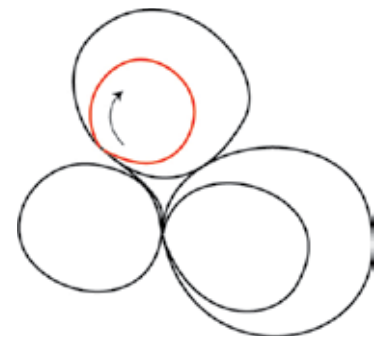
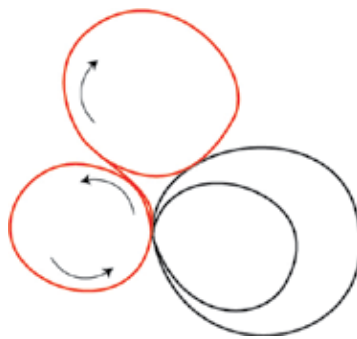
Circle Filler #4



1. Start by quilting a circle about the size of a quarter.



2. Without stopping, quilt another circle inside of the first one. Be sure to leave a noticeable gap between the inner and outer circle.



3. Quilt a couple more circles as normal, changing directions as you go. Then, at a random point, quilt an echo inside the circle.

Incorporate a little echoing to add emphasis to your quilting! Echoing the inside of your circles is not only fun, it looks great as well.

Why it's great:

- They can be used to draw attention to an area of your quilt.
- The unquilted area between the outer and inner circles becomes the focus of this design.
- Echoing the circle can help make the quilting more dense.

Try it on:

- Quilts with larger background areas.
- Modern Quilts
- Kids Quilts
- Any area that you want add a slightly different look to your quilting.

Tip: Try to quilt the inner circle so that there is a noticeable space between them. This will help each of the circles stand out and will make the design look intentional.
