

Suggested Supplies

You'll only need a few supplies to quilt along with me during the free video series!

Quilt Sandwich

You can quilt along with me on the custom challenge panel (*available in two sizes*), use an unfinished quilt top, or even some fat quarters. If quilting on a sewing machine, you can baste your quilt sandwich with any method that you prefer.

Machine Quilting Thread

High quality thread can help prevent tension issues and thread breaks. I will be demonstrating the designs using, Glide, a 40 weight thread. 50wt cotton also works great for machine quilting.

Needles

I prefer Superior Topstitch needles (*if quilting along on a sewing machine*) since they are strong enough to handle the stress of machine quilting. The size you use depends on the size of thread you're quilting with.

Removeable Marking Pen

I prefer the Mark B Gone water soluble marker, but any type will work fine. We will be using this to mark reference lines for our designs.



Optional Supplies

While not required, you may find the following supplies helpful for the video series.



Feather Meander Stencil

I designed for quilters of all levels, this stencil simplifies the intricate feather meander design.

Basic 8 Stencil

This stencil help quickly mark reference lines for the designs we'll be quilting in the blocks.

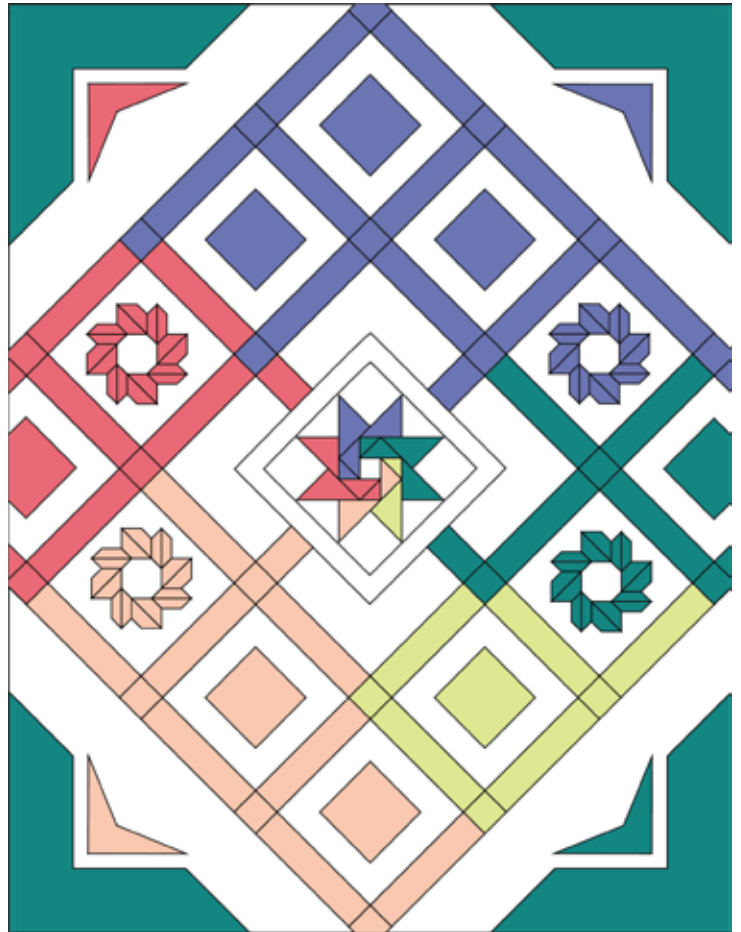
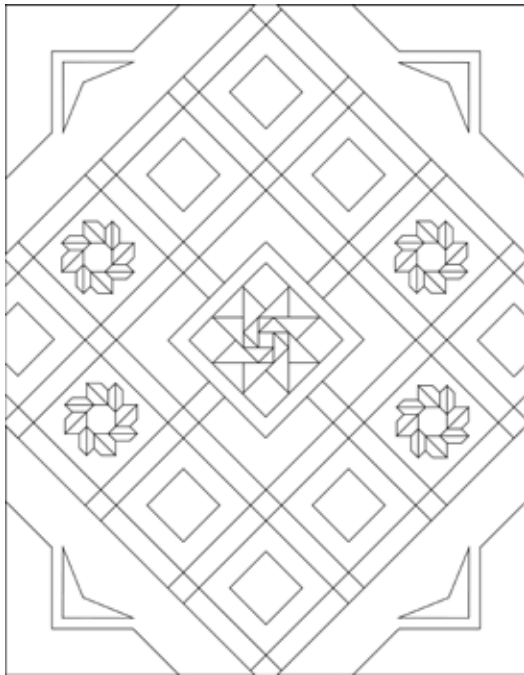
Other Machine Quilting Notions
